Cases increasing, but long-term effects of pandemic still unclear

Researchers want to know if the suspension of breast cancer screenings during the pandemic has affected late-stage diagnoses.

More than three years on from the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, when mammograms were suspended, the long-term effects on the number of breast cancer cases now and in years to come are still unknown. However, some evidence already points to a decrease in the rate of mammograms when compared with prior to the pandemic. This is particularly true for patients at-risk for severe COVID-19, according to a recent study in the journal Clinical Imaging. This may be because the fear of

contracting COVID-19 outweighs the fear of a breast cancer diagnosis, the study suggests. Fewer screenings are taking place in hospitals, but they are shifting to outpatient settings such as imaging centers or mobile sites.

Overall, one in eight women will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and one in 39 won't survive.

Estimates of new breast cancer cases have increased with the American Cancer Society determining that 297,790 women will receive a breast cancer diagnosis this year, up by about 7,200 cases from 2022.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women in the United States beside skin cancers. Even though the pandemic may have contributed to a slight slowing in progress in recent years, the rate of deaths from breast cancer have been steadily declining since 1989, down 43%. This is because of increased awareness, early screening and detection, and better treatments.

To prevent any slip in the progress of the last 30 years to save women's lives, boosting efforts regarding the safety of screenings could encourage women to return to regular mammograms.


